THESE INSTRUCTIONS ARE FOR YOUR PROTECTION, PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY.



- Know the controls and how to stop quickly. Read this Owner's Manual and review Riding Mower Manual. Wear safety glasses or eye shields while assembling or operating the riding mower with grass catcher attachment.
- 2. When using the riding mower with grass catcher at-
 - A. DO NOT operate the riding mower without the entire grass catcher assembly or discharge chute deflector in place.
 - B. Never make any adjustments or repairs while the engine is running.
 - Shut off engine when removing grass from grass catcher or unplugging mower chute or oatcher
 - DO NOT operate riding mower with grass catcher assembly while barefooted. ALWAYS wear substantial footwear, preferably steel-toed shoes. DO NOT wear loose fitting clothing that could get caught in any moving parts.
 - ALWAYS keep clear of discharge chutertube or any moving parts white engine is running.
 - F. Mow only in daylight or good artificial light.
- ALWAYS place the mower clutch lever in disengage position when not cutting grees, such as when crossing a rock or gravel driveway or roadway and

- when transporting the riding mower with grass catcher attachment.
- Disengage mower blades, stop engine, remove igni-tion key and set parking brake before leaving operator's position.
- Disengage power to mower blades, stop engine, re-move ignition key, set parking brake and disconnect spark plug wire before making any repairs, adjust-ments or cleaning the riding mower or grass catcher
- Check grass bags frequently for wear and/or deterioration. Replace worn or damaged bags.
- DO NOT run engine indoors. Exhaust fumes contain CARBON MONOXIDE which is an ODORLESS and
- Take all possible precentions when leaving the riding mower unstrended, such as disengaging the mower clutch lever, shifting into neutral, setting parking brake, stopping engine and removing ignition key.
- NEVER store grass catcher with grass clippings in the catcher bags. Even a small pile of grass clippings can create enough heat to start a fire.
- 10. If grass outcher attachment will be used on other than level ground, the use of a front weight box is recommended.




MOWER DECK ASSEMBLY

NOTE: If your unit has a mulching plug installed remove it at this

Mower deck assembly includes installation of latch lever for lower chute (FIG. 1-ASSY).

To install tatch lever, do the following:

- 1. Remove rear screw (1) and nut (2) on chute deflector bracket (3), which is located on the right-hand side of mower
- 2. Place latch lever (5) through slot in front of chute deflector bracket with stud on lever pointing down.
- 3. Make sure end of torsion spring (6) is on top of letch lever (FIG. 1-ASSY). NOTE: Slide spring rearward toward latch lever mounting screw as far as possible.
- 4. Attach latch laver to bracket with screw and nut removed in step 1.
 - 5. Place plastic tab (7) on end of latch lever.




INSTALL MOUNTING BRACKETS

- 1. Remove four 5/16 inch hex head taptite screws from rear of tractor.
 - 2. Raise tractor seat.

NOTE: it may be easier to install mounting brackets if the battery is removed. See Battery Removal in Owner's/Operator's


- 3. Align bottom hole and third from bottom hole in right-hand mounting bracket (B) with holes in rear of tractor (FIG. 2-ASSY).
- 4. Insert two 5/16-18 x 1 inch screws (1) (found in parts bag) into holes. On inside of the battery compariment place a bracket plate (2) on each screw. Place a 11/32 inch flawasher (3) and 5/16 inch locknut (4) on end of each screw and tighten securely (FIG. 2-ASSY).
 - 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for left-hand mounting bracket (A).



ASSEMBLE YOUR GRASS CATCHER


INSTALL GRASS CATCHER COVER (FIG. 3-ASSY)

- Slide grass catcher support legs (1) over left and right hand mounting brackets (2,3).
- Align holes in legs of grass catcher support with holes in mounting brackets.
 - 3. Insert a 1-3/4 inch clevis pin (4) through holes.
 - 4. Insert a 1-5/8 inch hairpin (5) in hole of clavis pins.




INSTALL LOWER CHUTE ASSEMBLY ON UPPER CHUTE (FIG. 425-ASSY)

1. Install two rubber straps (1,2) on end of lower chute (3) with two 1.4 x 1 inch hex head screws (4), four 9x32 inch flatwashers (5) and two 1.4 inch locknuts (6) (FIG. 4-ASSY). NOTE: Tighten bolt until nut is flush with end of bolt. NOTE: Open end of "\$" hook (7) is downward on rear rubber strap (1) and upward on front rubber strap (2).




- 2. Lift up on chute deflector.
- Slide tab on lower end of lower chute (1) under center of CHUTE DEFLECTOR BRACKET (2) (not latch lever) until stud on latch lever (3) snaps into the hole in end of tab (See FIG. 5. ASSY).
- Attach "S" hook (4) on the end of front rubber strap (5) to latch lever (FIG. 5-A6SY).
- Attach "S" hook (4) on end of the <u>rear rubber strap</u> (6) to spring anchor bolt (7) (FIG. 5-ASSY), NOTE: Spring end may need to be moved up to make room for "S" hook.




INSTALL UPPER CHUTE ASSEMBLY ON LOWER CHUT!!

- 1. Rotate chute latch (1) to the outside of upper chute (2) (FIG. 6-ASSY).
- 2. Place end of upper chute (2) in hole in front of grass catcher cover (3). Latch should be on top as per illustration (FIG.
- 3. Align latch end of upper chute (2) with lower chute (4), inserting lower chute by pulling upper chute over lower chute. Slide end all the way down to the stop (5) on lower chute (FIG.
- 4. Lift up on chute latch (1) and rotate over stop (5) on lower chute (FIG. 6-ASSY).



INSTALL GRASS CATCHER BAGS FIG. 7-ASSY

- 1. Make sure rubber straps (1) with "S" hooks on each side of grass catcher lid (2) are unhooked. Lift grass calcher lid.
- 2. Place bags (3) on grass catcher support (4) with solid material facing wheels, NOTE: Install left hand bag first,
 - 3. Close grass catcher lid and hook rubber straps.

The operation of your tractor and grass catcher can result in objects being thrown into the eyes, which can result in severe eye damage. Always wear safety glasses or eye shields while operating your tractor. We recommend standard safety glasses, or a Wide Vision safety mask for over spectacles.



Get to know your tractor and its controls. Be sure you (or any other operator) have read and understand the Safety Rules on page 2 of this manual and in Owner's/Operator's Manual for your tractor.

OPERATING TRACTOR WITH CATCHER

Extra care should be taken when operating a tractor with a grass catcher or other attachment. Any attachment extends the length of the machine. Operator should be aware that more space is required for turns with a tractor and attachment then with a tractor only.

Take a comfortable position on your tractor and start the angine. After the engine has warmed up, depress clutch-brake pedal and move shift control lever to a low forward speed. Release clutch-brake pedal slowly and tractor will move forward.

Until you get the feel of the tractor with its added weight and length, stay in low speed range. When you feel comortable move shift control lever to desired forward speed. With mover blades stopped, take a test run in a large, open, level area. Learn to start, stop and change direction in this area. Always stop engine before leaving operator's position.

To operate tractor with catcher salely:

- Be sure area is clear of obstacles and other people before moving.
- Avoid sharp turns at high speed. Use slow speed, and be aware that the catcher attachment swings out further than the tractor when making turns. Allow at least 25 inches extra for the turn.
- Do not use grass catcher on steep slopes.
- Do not turn on slopes unless necessary, and then, turn slowly and gradually downhill, if possible.
- Be extra cautious on hills. Keep all uphill and downhill movement slow and gradual. Do not make sudden changes in speed or direction.

- Do not mow in reverse unless absolutely necessary. Always look down and behind before and while backing.
- Do not mow near drop-offs, ditches, or embankments.
- Use extra care when approaching blind corners, shrubs, trees, or other objects that may obscure vision.

KEEP THE EQUIPMENT CLEAN. Grass clippings may pack under mower chassis and in grass chutes due to internal moisture content of grass. This accumulation of grass clippings should be removed after each mowing.

- Turn Ignition key to OFF position, remove key and set parking brake on tractor.
- Scrape grass clippings off the underside of mower deck with a putty knife or similar tool. Cleaning underside of mower housing is easier if mower deck is removed. See Remove The Mower Deck paragraph in Maintenance section of Owner's Operator's Manual for your tractor.
- Remove upper and lower chutes from mower deck and grass catcher cover assembly. Flush grass clippings from upper and lower chutes with water.
- Remove grass catcher bags. Flush grass clippings from cover assembly with water.



CAUTION



Take extra care in making turns with tractor and grass catcher or other attachment.

Because the strachment extends beyond the tractor, more epace is required for turns.

Sharp turns could bring grass catcher in contact with nearby objects, such as trees or buildings, and cause damage or injury.


tips for improved bagging

Follow the mower operation instructions in your tractor owner's manual. To improve begging operation:

- Always run throttle at full speed when bagging.
- The forward speed of the tractor is determined by the quantity of grass being mowed. The more grass that must be cut, the slower the forward speed. When cutting light grass, forward speed may be increased.
- It may be necessary to overlap width of cut to suit certain conditions.
- If grass is extremely tall, it should be moved twice the first time relatively high, the second time to desired height.
- To mow heavy growth or on rough ground, set mower at maximum cutting height. After growth is cleared, reduce cutting height as desired.
- The cutting height should not be set too low on thick, lush tawns, or grass may die. Also, if cutting height is too low, deck wheels may sink into fawn, causing mower deck to drop down on grass and reduce discharging effect of cutting blade.

OPERATE YOUR GRASS CATCHER

- New grass should be cut in the atternoon when it is dry.
 Never cut wet grass. Wet grass will pack under mower deck and in grass chutes and will not discharge properly.
- If the grass catcher fails to pick up cut grass or feaves, it is an indication that clogging has occurred (See To Clear A Plugged Grass Chute).
- For best cutting and bagging results, mower blades must be kept sharp. Replace bent or damaged blades.





DANGER



DO NOT OPERATE YOUR TRACTOR UNLESS THE ENTIRE GRASS CATCHER IS IN PLACE.

CLEAR A PLUGGED GRASS CHUTE

Your grass catcher chute may become plugged with grass clippings due to over-filling grass catcher bage or cutting grass that is too long or wet. To unplug chute, do the following:

 Move mower clutch lever to OFF position, move shift control lever to neutral position, turn engine off and set parking brake.

THE BLADES ON MOWER DECK WILL NOT STOP IMMEDIATELY. KEEP YOUR HANDS AND FEET FROM UNDER MOWER AND AWAY FROM GRASS CATCHER CHUTE.

- Lift up on upper chute lever latch and pull upper chute away from lower chute.
 - 3. Clear grass clippings out of upper chute.
- Disconnect the two subber straps holding lower chute to mover deck.
- 5. Lift front end of latch lever and pull lower chute away from mower deck.
 - 6. Clear grass clippings out of lower chute.
- 7. Clear grass clippings from mower deck chute deflector assembly.
- Re-attach chute assembly to grass patcher and mower deck in reverse order of removal.

EMPTY GRASS CATCHER BAGS

At frequent intervals, stop your tractor and check grass catcher bags. Bags should be empiled as acon as dippings reach top of bag and after each use. Bags are full when grass dippings begin to come out of hole underneath upper chute.

To empty bag, do the following:

- Move attachment clurch lever to OFF (disengaged) position and move shift control lever to neutral.
 - 2. Stop engine and set parking brake on tractor.
- Unhook rubber straps (1) and lift up on cover lid (2) (FIG. 1-OP).
- Lift bag assemblies (3) from support (4). Remove righthand bag first.
 - Remove all clippings from bags.

STORAGE

The grass catcher should be immediately prepared for storage at end of season. To prepare grass catcher for storage, do the following:

- 1. Remove and clean upper and lower chutes.
- 2. Remove and empty grass bags.
- 3. Clean grass catcher cover and lid thoroughly.
- Inspect grass catcher and mower deck for worn or damaged parts. Tighten all loose hardware.
- Check grass bags for wear and/or deterioration. Replace any worn or damaged bags.
- Store your tractor and grass catcher in a clean, dry area and cover for additional protection.

NEVER store grass catcher with grass clippings in bags. Even a small pile of grass clippings can create enough heat to start a lire.


NOTE

The grass catcher can be easily lifted off tractor to reduce the storage space.

to remove grass catcher

- Disconnect chute latch and pull upper chute from lower chute. Slide upper chute from hole in the front of the cover assembly and set aside.
- Remove hairpins from clevis pins holding grass catcher support to mounting brackets. Remove clevis pins.
- Lift grass catcher support and cover assembly from mounting brackets and set aside.
- Detach "S" hooks on end of rubber straps attached to lower chute from the spring anchor bolt in the rear and from the latch lever in front. Lift front end of latch lever and pull lower chute away from mower deck. Sat chute aside.
- 5. Lower chute deflector into discharge position, NOTE: Make sure chute deflector falls into correct position to discharge grass, if lawn tractor is used without grass catcher installed. NEVEROPERATE LAWN TRACTOR WITH GRASS CATCHER PARTIALLY INSTALLED.
- Keep mounting hardware in a plastic bag. Store hardware, catcher support-cover assembly and chutes in a box or other sale place where catcher bags will not be damaged.
